POSITION EXISTS IN: Rockland County Solid Waste Management Authority.

<u>RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS</u>: Candidates must be legal residents of Rockland County at the time of examination.

<u>SALARY</u>: The starting salary is \$100,000 annually for a 40-hour workweek with the Rockland County Solid Waste Management Authority.

<u>WHAT THE JOB IS LIKE</u>: This is work of a moderately complex nature involving the planning, organization, coordination and execution of projects and initiatives between local, state and/or federal government agencies. The incumbent is responsible for developing, managing and executing strategies to achieve the goals of their agency in conjunction with the other levels of government. The work is performed under the general direction of the head of the agency or other higher-level administrator with considerable latitude for independent judgment. Does related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: By examination date, you must have:

A Bachelor's degree or higher and three (3) years of paid work experience which substantially involved coordinating or implementing phases of projects or programs involving federal, New York state, or local government agencies.

<u>NOTE</u>: If using college credits to qualify, official college transcripts must be sent directly from the educational institution to the Rockland County Department of Personnel no later than two (2) months after the exam date, December 22, 2022; student transcripts are not acceptable. Your college degree and/or college credit must have been awarded by a college or university accredited by a regional, national, or specialized agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education/U.S. Secretary of Education. If your degree and/or college credit was awarded by an educational institution outside the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. You can write the Rockland County Department of Personnel for a list of acceptable companies who provide this service. This form is also available on the Rockland County website: <u>www.rocklandgov.com</u>. You must pay the required evaluation fee.

NOTE: Any outstanding application documentation must be submitted to the Rockland County Department of Personnel no later than two (2) weeks prior to the exam date. Failure to comply with the deadlines set herein may result in the disapproval of your application; disqualification from sitting for the examination; and/or disqualification from a resulting list of eligible candidates. These deadlines are subject to change by the Rockland County Department of Personnel upon notice to a candidate.

SUBJECT OF WRITTEN EXAMINATION:

- 1. <u>Preparing Written Material</u> These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.
- 2. <u>Understanding and Interpreting Written Material</u> These questions test for the ability to understand and interpret written material. You will be presented with brief reading passages and will be asked questions about the passages. You should base your answers to the questions **only** on what is presented in the passages and **not** on what you may happen to know about the topic.
- 3. <u>Understanding and Interpreting Tabular Material</u> These questions test your ability to understand, analyze, and use the internal logic of data presented in tabular form. You may be asked to perform tasks such as completing tables, drawing conclusions from them, analyzing data trends or interrelationships, and revising or combining data sets. The concepts of rate, ratio, and proportion are tested. Mathematical operations are simple, and computational speed is not a major factor in the test. You should bring with you a hand-held battery- or solar-powered calculator for use on this test</u>. You will not be permitted to use the calculator function of your cell phone.
- 4. <u>Evaluating Conclusions in Light of Known Facts</u> These questions will consist of a set of facts and a conclusion. You must decide if the conclusion is proved by the facts, disproved by the facts or if the facts are not sufficient to prove or disprove the conclusion. The questions will not be specific to a particular field.
