

PUBLIC HEALTH TECHNICIAN I (OC) **RC/EL #50016010**

Applications Continuously Accepted and Examination Dates are Held Continuously During the Week (Tuesday – Friday). Approved Candidates will be notified of their examination date approximately 10 days prior to the examination.

A \$15 non-refundable application filing fee is required. Please refer to Supplement A for further information regarding the application/examination process. Applications are available at: https://mycivilservice.rocklandgov.com/exams.

- 1. If applying online, payment can be submitted electronically.
- 2. If applying by mail, completed applications must be accompanied by a check or money order made payable to the Rockland County Commissioner of Finance.

POSITIONS EXIST IN: The Rockland County Department of Health.

RESIDENCE REQUIREMENT: Candidates must be legal residents of the States of New York, New Jersey or Connecticut at the time of application submission for the examination.

SALARY: The starting salary is \$31.71 per hour for a 35-hour-workweek with the County of Rockland. Salary will be pro-rated for less than full-time positions.

WHAT THE JOB IS LIKE: This is entry-level technical public health or environmental health work involving a responsibility for making inspections and gathering information relative to the operation of the various public health or environmental health programs administered by the Department of Health. The work is performed under the direction of a Public Health professional. Does related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: At the time of application submission, you must have: An Associate's degree, or equivalent college credits, (minimum of sixty (60) credit hours), or higher degree, which must have included or been supplemented by a minimum of fifteen (15) credit hours in natural sciences*, of which not more than six (6) credit hours may be in the applied sciences**.

*Natural science shall be defined as science such as biology, chemistry or physics that deals with the objects, phenomena, or laws of nature and the physical world. It shall include all physical and biological sciences. **Applied science shall be defined as science-based courses in environmental, sanitation and medical technology, public health, infection control or food science.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT:

- Must complete a public health training course approved by New York State Department of Health within two (2) 1. years of appointment.
- 2. Possession of a valid motor vehicles license or accessibility to transportation to meet field work requirements in a timely and efficient manner.

TRANSCRIPTS: If using college credits to qualify, official college transcripts must be sent directly from the educational institution to the Rockland County Department of Personnel at rcexams@co.rockland.ny.us no later than ten (10) days after the submission of your application; student transcripts are not acceptable. Failure to comply with the deadlines set herein may result in the disapproval of your application and/or disqualification from a resulting list of eligible candidates. Your college degree and/or college credit must have been awarded by a college or university accredited by a regional, national, or specialized agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education/U.S. Secretary of Education. If your degree and/or college credit was awarded by an educational institution outside the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. Candidates are responsible for any required evaluation fees. ALL OUTSTANDING APPLICATION DOCUMENTATION: Any outstanding application documentation must be submitted to the Rockland County Department of Personnel no later than ten (10) days after the submission of your application. Failure to comply with the deadlines set herein may result in the disapproval of your application; disqualification from sitting for the examination; and/or disqualification from a resulting list of eligible candidates. These deadlines are subject to change by the Rockland County Department of Personnel upon notice to a candidate.

EXAM ADMINISTRATION: The written test will be administered on a personal computer (PC) and **will be held on a weekday**. Candidates need no prior knowledge of computers in order to take the test. The test uses a simple point-and-click system that is thoroughly explained through an animated instruction program. Candidates will be given a sample test on which to practice before the actual test begins.

SUBJECT OF WRITTEN EXAMINATION:

- 1. <u>Arithmetic Reasoning</u> These questions test your ability to solve an arithmetic problem presented in sentence or short paragraph form.
- 2. <u>Understanding and Interpreting Written Material</u> These questions test how well you comprehend written material.
- 3. <u>Principles of Biology, Chemistry and General Science</u> These questions test for basic understanding of the physical world around you and the scientific laws that govern it.

USE OF CALCULATORS IS PERMITTED FOR THIS EXAMINATION

A candidate is permitted to take a Public Health Technician I examination <u>prepared by the NYS Department of</u> <u>Civil Service</u> only <u>once</u> during each of the following defined periods:

July 1 – December 31 January 1 – June 30

ELIGIBLE LIST: This examination is being prepared and rated in accordance with Section 23(2) of the Civil Service Law. The provisions of the New York State Civil Service Law, Rules, and Regulations dealing with the preparation and rating of examinations, as well as establishment and certification of eligible lists for positions in the classified service will apply to this examination.

Successful candidates will have their names placed on an eligible list for this title in order of their ranking, regardless of the date on which they take the test. Candidates' scores from the different testing dates will be interfiled. The names of successful candidates will remain on the list for one (1) year to fill present and future vacancies.
