1. If applying online, completed applications and electronic payment must be submitted by 11:59 PM EST on the last filing date.
2. If applying by mail, completed applications must be postmarked no later than the last filing date accompanied by a check or money order made payable to the Rockland County Commissioner of Finance.

**POSITION EXISTS IN:** Rockland County Department of Health.

An open-competitive as well as a promotion examination will be given on the same day and qualified candidates may also compete therein by filing a separate application for each. The promotion list will take precedence over the open-competitive list in filling vacancies in the agency listed, but upon its exhaustion, the open-competitive list will be used to fill vacancies occurring for a period of at least one year from the date the list was established.

**RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS:** Candidates must be legal residents of the States of New York, New Jersey or Connecticut at the time of application submission for the examination.

**SALARY:** The starting salary is \$39.99 per hour for a 35-hour work week with Rockland County. Salary will be pro-rated for less than full-time positions. Salary may vary in other locations.

**WHAT THE JOB IS LIKE:** This position involves technical public health or environmental health duties, including overseeing inspection activities, investigating complaints and maintaining detailed records related to the operation of various public health and environmental health programs administered by the Department of Health. The work is performed under the direction of a higher-level Public Health administrator and supervision is provided to technical staff. Does related work as required.

**When completing the application, your description of experience must specify the dates of your employment, the number of hours worked per week, your title, and the main duties for each. Be specific; vagueness will not be resolved in your favor. Candidates who submit incomplete applications or documentation may be disqualified.**

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:** At the time of application submission, you must have: An Associate's degree or higher or equivalent college credits (minimum of sixty (60) credits), which must have included or been supplemented by a minimum of fifteen (15) credits in natural sciences\*, with no more than six (6) credits in the applied sciences\*\*, and two (2) years of paid work experience conducting inspections and/or investigating complaints in a public health or environmental health setting.

**SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:**

1. Must complete a public health training course approved by the New York State Department of Health within two (2) years of appointment.
2. Possession of a valid motor vehicle license or accessibility to transportation to meet field work requirements in a timely and efficient manner.

\*Natural science shall be defined as science such as biology, chemistry or physics that deals with the objects, phenomena, or laws of nature and the physical world. It shall include all physical and biological sciences.

\*\*Applied science shall be defined as science-based courses in environmental, sanitation and medical technology, public health, infection control or food science.

**TRANSCRIPTS:** If using college credits to qualify, official college transcripts must be sent directly from the educational institution to the Rockland County Department of Personnel at [rcexams@co.rockland.ny.us](mailto:rcexams@co.rockland.ny.us) no later than two (2) months after the last filing date; student transcripts are not acceptable. Failure to comply with the deadlines set herein may result in the disapproval of your application and/or disqualification from a resulting list of eligible candidates. Your college degree and/or college credit must have been awarded by a college or university accredited by a regional, national, or specialized agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education/U.S. Secretary of Education. If your degree and/or college credit was awarded by an educational institution outside the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. Candidates are responsible for any required evaluation fees. **ANTICIPATED ELIGIBILITY - AGE AND EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS:**

According to Civil Service Law, section 54 which became effective September 4, 2024, applicants who are within 12 months of meeting the minimum age or attaining the minimum educational requirements following the date of examination, may take the civil service exam, but will be restricted from certification until such a time that the minimum age or educational requirements are met. Candidates will be required to provide proof of qualifying age and/or education within 12 months of exam date in order to be eligible for appointment from a certified list.

**ALL OUTSTANDING APPLICATION DOCUMENTATION:** Must be submitted to the Rockland County Department of Personnel no later than two (2) weeks prior to the exam date. Failure to comply with the deadlines set herein may result in the disapproval of your application; disqualification from sitting for the examination; and/or disqualification from a resulting list of eligible candidates. These deadlines are subject to change by the Rockland County Department of Personnel upon notice to a candidate.

**SUBJECT OF WRITTEN EXAMINATION:**

1. Preparing Written Material – These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibility. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.
2. Inspection and Interviewing Techniques – These questions test your ability to select the proper course of action in situations which might occur during routine inspections. Question topics may cover, but will not be limited to, such areas as interviewing, gathering information and evidence, maintaining proper attitude, and handling irregularities and violations with integrity and sound judgment. Some questions may be in a situational format while others may deal with the proper principles and practices of inspection.
3. Application of Scientific Principles and Knowledge to Public and Environmental Health Protection – These questions test for knowledge of public and environmental health principles, the ability to investigate and identify the causes of various public and environmental health problems, and to recommend the appropriate remedial actions for such problems.
4. Microbiology as Related to Disease Prevention and Control, Sanitary Chemistry, and Toxic Substances – These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices of microbiology involved in disease prevention and control, including such areas as food, water and environmental sanitation, toxic substances, and communicable diseases.
5. Supervision – These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices employed in planning, organizing, and controlling the activities of a work unit toward predetermined objectives. The concepts covered, usually in a situational question format, include such topics as assigning and reviewing work; evaluating performance; maintaining work standards; motivating and developing subordinates; implementing procedural change; increasing efficiency; and dealing with problems of absenteeism, morale, and discipline.
