PARENT ADVOCATE

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: This position is responsible for providing support to parents/caregivers, including assisting them in locating services and connecting them with support systems while navigating the child welfare system. The work is performed under the direct supervision of a higher-level supervisor. Does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:

Provides support and advocacy to parents/caregivers by helping them navigate a variety of programs and systems (e.g., child welfare, family court, etc.);

Assists parents/caregivers in identifying available resources and provides guidance on finding essential services;

Picks up and transports clients to appointments, meetings, etc.;

Attends meetings, conferences and appointments with parents/caregivers to advocate for their children's rights;

Provides information and referrals to parents/caregivers, as needed;

Acts as a liaison between parent/caregiver and the caseworker to provide and/or exchange information; Keeps accurate records of interactions with parents/caregivers and the progress made in addressing their concerns;

Assists families in building a strong support network.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS:

Good knowledge of the child welfare and family court systems; working knowledge of self-help techniques; working knowledge of available services and programs for families; ability to provide support and assistance to parents and caregivers; ability to establish and maintain cooperative relationships with others; ability to understand and carry out oral and written instructions; ability to understand and interpret written material; ability to prepare reports.

<u>MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS</u>: Graduation from high school or possession of an equivalency diploma <u>and</u> a former participant* in the child welfare system as a parent/caregiver with a previous child welfare case closed for at least two (2) years.

*A written statement describing your experience as a former participant (parent/caregiver) in the child welfare system must be included with your application.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Possession of a valid driver's license.
- Verification of participation in the child welfare system with most recent case closed for at least two (2) years.
