## **SEWAGE SYSTEM MECHANIC II**

<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:</u> This is skilled work of a responsible nature involving the servicing and maintenance of a sanitary sewer collection system, both on a scheduled and emergency basis, in order to ensure the safe and efficient operation of a sanitary sewer collection system. The work is distinguished from that of a Sewage System Mechanic I in the complexity of assignments and the responsibility for overseeing field crew employment. The work is performed under the general supervision of the Director of Plant Facilities or higher-level administrator and work guidance (e.g. lead work) is provided to a number of field crew employees. Employees in this class are on call at any time. Does related work as required.

## **TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:**

Coordinates and provides work guidance to field crews in the maintenance and operation of a sanitary sewer collection system;

Makes inspections of sanitary sewer lines, generally involving use of television inspection equipment;

Participates in the repair of lines, manholes, air release valves, chambers, connections, etc.;

Performs routine maintenance of sewer lines and clears blockages using specialized equipment;

Maintains detailed activity records, including those on all inspections;

Operates an electric finder to locate pipes;

Conducts "smoke testing" of house connections;

Maintains inventories of supplies and equipment;

Operates motorized equipment in the laying of pipes;

Operates tapping equipment, motor vehicles, etc. and may perform routine maintenance work on same;

May participate in the operation of grouting equipment;

May train employees in safety and work procedures.

## FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS:

Thorough knowledge of materials, practices, tools and terminology required for the maintenance of a sanitary sewer collection system; ability to understand and carry out oral and written instructions; ability to provide work guidance to field crews in sewer inspection and maintenance operations; ability to make simple calculations; ability to use computerized maps\*; ability to use computer applications in the completion of assignments\*; ability to record figures accurately and prepare clear records and reports.

<u>MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:</u> Graduation from high school or possession of a New York State equivalency diploma <u>and</u> four (4) years of experience in public works maintenance and/or construction which included work in the area of sewers, at least one (1) year of which must have been in a supervisory capacity or in a position that substantially involved providing work guidance or direction to others.

**PROMOTION:** Two (2) years as a Sewage System Mechanic I or equivalent title.

**SPECIAL REQUIREMENT:** Possession of a valid driver's license appropriate for the kind and size of vehicle to be operated.
